

Currently **36 full time staff** members dedicate their time to your recreational pursuits. Staff includes program coordinators, supervisors, managers, facilities staff and administrative positions.


In addition, Recreation employs over **480 hourly staff members** who directly serve the public.




That's a lot of recreators!

- 1. In 2015, the Senior Center's total attendance was **482,960**
- 2. EPIC's attendance was close behind with **406,239**
- 3. Northside Aztlan's attendance was 189,807
- 4. Mulberry Pool's attendance was 70,489
- 5. The Farm's total attendance was 63,165
- 6. City Park Pool was 52,545






Recreation Revenue

In 2015, Recreation received **\$1.3M** in Keeping Fort Collins Great funds


The City's general fund provided \$889,126




- The Recreation Department was appropriated \$190,000 for the reduced fee program
- The total amount requested was **\$228,881**, Recreation funds covered the balance.
- Recreation's reduced fee program provided passes to over 1,760 children in 2015
- Kids participated in activities throughout Recreation including: child development, sports, Northside classes, etc.




- **Poudre School District** has the most Intergovernmental Agreements (IGA) with the Recreation Department.

The Recreation Department has been providing Senior Citizens with programs for over 30 years, the current Fort Collins Senior Center was **unveiled in 1995**.

The **\$6.8M**, **18,000 square foot expansion** opened in 2014.


The Senior Center is packed with great features:

- 25-yard two-lane lap pool
- 10-person spa
- Indoor jog/walk track
- Gymnasium
- Auditorium
- Health and Wellness wing
- Expanded cardio/weight room
- Community rooms


Soak up some fun!

- There are **542,500** gallons of water in the main pool at EPIC.
- The pool temperatures at all pools are different:
 - o Mulberry Pool: Main Pool: 85; Spa: 101
 - o EPIC: Main Pool: 82; Wader: 85; Therapy: 92
 - City Park Pool: 85 (without the sun, and yes, we heat it)
 - o Fort Collins Senior Center: Main Pool: 86; Spa: 101
- It takes **2000** gallons of anti-freeze to winterize the pipes at City Park Pool.
- Three National Titles have been broken at EPIC in 2012 50 yard back women, 50 yard free women, 50 meter butterfly in the 12 year old age group.




Northside Aztlan Community Center has the largest cardio and weight area. The cardio and weight area is **3,440** square feet. Equipment includes:
