Greetings Members of the Friends,

Just as The Gardens has experienced growth and maturation over the last several years, Friends of The Gardens has responded in kind on several fronts. Two years ago, we committed to several strategic goals, and despite the challenges of the COVID pandemic, I am proud to report that we have met and are on track to our stated goals which included:

- **Board Development and Recruitment:** We committed to increase Board membership to eight members by December 2021, 10 by December 2022 and 12 by December 2023, and I am excited to announce that we have met our 2021 and 2022 goals! We are grateful to those who have recently joined our organization.
- **Membership:** Membership has increased fivefold since 2019, and in May of 2022 we reached 3,000 active Members! Keep reading for more exciting news regarding our membership program, and thank you for being a Member!

Committing to a central repository means that all members of The Friends and other appropriate personnel have access to meeting minutes, annual reports, bylaws, and our ongoing Memorandum of Understanding with the City of Fort Collins among other items. The result has been more streamlined and coordinated decision-making.

Serving on The Friends board has been a privilege and rewarding experience, and I want to thank my fellow board members for their hard work and dedication through it all. As we look ahead to the 2023 growing season, we have exciting announcements in the works. And thanks to your support, the Gardens continues to bloom.

VOLUNTEERS SURVEY LOCAL BUTTERFLY AND BIRD BIODIVERSITY

We love gardens for their vibrant and subtle beauties. Gardens also play an important role in urban environments by providing resources and shelter for urban wildlife. Volunteers called Biodiversity Monitors for the City of Fort Collins Nature in the City program spend the summer doing bird and butterfly surveys to help quantify the importance of these oasis for wildlife in the city.

Since 2016, volunteers have performed bird and butterfly surveys at the Gardens on Spring Creek. The Gardens are consistently high in diversity of both bird and butterfly species compared to other urban sites surveyed—likely due to the abundance of floral resources, seeds and berries available in the gardens. Additionally, its proximity to Spring Creek, an important wildlife corridor through our city, also plays an important role.

Using data from The Gardens and dozens of other sites, researchers at Colorado State University and the Wildlife Conservation Society found lands in Fort Collins managed with wildlife in mind host more diversity of bird and butterfly species. This is good news for all of us. It means the efforts of the Gardens on Spring Creek and the Nature in the City program to diversify and beautify spaces is working. It means efforts you make in your space also helps wildlife. Lastly, it means the wildlife we see in our city can have a place to live and thrive.

BUCKETS OF BULBS! 4,000 BULBS COMING TO THE GARDENS!

Gardening in the middle of one of the world's four great steppes is no feat for the weary. Triple digit highs, subzero lows, intense sun and desiccating wind are not only normal, but are

expected annually in Northern Colorado. Particularly intolerant of such poor treatment, woody plants treat

the region much like how I would treat a choir concert in spring of 2019; they've made themselves dang scarce. As a result, gardeners in our region tend to use such plants sparingly, and in less diversity than others. It's not uncommon, in fact, to hear the Front Range referred to as an "herbaceous region" due to the emphasis we place on plants that spring from their roots each year, looking fresh no matter what they may have endured in the previous season. At the same time, another type of plant has evolved to thrive in steppes and adjacent climates, like the Mediterranean: geophytes. Meaning "earth lover," which describes their seasonal disappearance below an insulating blanket of soil to simply wait out unfavorable weather, geophytes consist of bulbs (made of modified leaves), corms (modified stems) and tubers (modified rhizomes, a type of stem), among a few other botanical designations. It's common for us to refer to these all as bulbs, as they are used similarly and appear alike to the casual observer. At the Gardens on Spring Creek, as part of our emphasis on gardening in synchronization with our climate, soils and place, we use a lot of bulbs! This year, our order was a big one and will be arriving any day.

In coming weeks, our horticulture staff will be slamming -er-gently placing these 4,000 geophytes The Undaunted Garden is also set to receive in their new homes. Bought in bulk from specialty another massive round of bulb planting, with 1,950 growers, this year's bulb order will increase spring bulbs earmarked for its beds by mid-November. interest across the grounds at a time when most Complimenting the already substantial and tasteful herbaceous plants remain dormant. Additionally, the collection of geophytes in the space, visitors should new bulbs will diversify our collections by adding watch for growing numbers of a few taxa already in the several new cultivars and species to the overall garden, like the elegant, icy blue 'Valerie Finnis' grape landscape. Some will be grown for sale as holiday hyacinth (*Muscari*), greater numbers of fall-blooming plants in our gift shop by late November, so keep your crocus—quite striking when interplanted into falleyes peeled for both paperwhites and amaryllis. reddening sedum—and numerous species tulips. Mostly *Tulipa batalinii*, they will present in pastel yellows, apricots and salmons with low-growing, narrow foliage.

At the south end of our site, horticulturist Jessica Clarke will be planting fall, not spring, blooming crocus by the cultivar name of 'Oxonian'. A last flash before chilly weather sets in, these saffron relatives present with large, intensely colored, cup-shaped blooms and contrasting, tendril-like orange stamens in the center. Elsewhere in the Children's Garden, watch for other fall blooming Crocus, like the refined white *Crocus orchroleucus*.

Anything but refined, I've opted to pop visitor's eyeballs out by adding 400 flaming hot T*ulipa kolpakowskiana* to the Rock Garden. A personal favorite, this species tulip is as flashy as its name is terrifying, with golden centers and three contrasting apricot-colored sepals on the outside. I will be

contrasting and undulating ribbon of the plant with the much mellower, cool-blue *Muscari neglectum* 'Baby's Breath' in similar numbers. Softer yellow and earlierblooming, masses of *Crocus chysanthus* 'Cream Beauty' will add a gentle accent in other parts of the garden.

A stone's throw from the Undaunted Garden, I installed—with lots of help—a "*Camassia* river" last year in the Prairie Garden. Beginning around a bench at the southern edge, the river takes a gently sinuous route down the garden's length, terminating near the Wetland's boardwalk. Currently, cobalt blues comprise most of the display, and aren't as effective visually in a monochrome as they would be if studded with light blues and whites. So, to compliment the 700 cobalt-blue *Camassia* in the space, I'll be adding (hopefully once again with lots of help) 550 more, this time in sky-blues and whites. One of the few bulbs native to prairies of the Unite States, these taxa are serving to help improve early-season interest in this garden's otherwise sluggish spring display.

With so many bulbs set to be planted in so little time, there is virtually no chance the Gardens will see a sluggish fall. Of course, these plantings will take place in addition to our annual holiday light display setup, including displays for Pumpkins on Parade and Día de Muertos. So, whether you might be more entertained by seeing what a 4,000-bulb display or its installation might look like, or something else entirely, don't hesitate to stop by the Gardens.
