## Step by Step | How to Plan this Event

1-2 Months Before Event

## 1. Set a Time \& Location

- Pick a time when most of your neighbors will be available.
- Pick a spot with adequate space for all of your guests and tables for them to eat at.


## 2 <br> Obtain Any Necessary Permits and Permissions

If you're closing a residential street, you will need to apply for a Block Party. Permit for an eligible street.

2 Purchase Ice Cream and Toppings

- Buy pre-packaged ice cream from local stores. Choose a variety of ice cream flavors.
- Get weird! Purchase conventional toppings, like chocolate chips, and fun surprises, such as spices.
- Alternatively, consider inviting guests to make ice cream using the "sandwich bag" method.



## Make Your Own Ice Cream Sandwich Bag Method

- Put $1 / 2$ cup of half-and-half, 1 tablespoon sugar, and 1/4 teaspoon vanilla into a small sandwich bag. Squeeze out extra air and seal.
- In a gallon sized plastic bag, mix ice and rock salt.
- Place the small bag inside the larger one. Shake or squeeze for 7 to 10 minutes until the ice cream firms up.
- Take the small bag out of the large one and add toppings!

- At Least 2-3 Weeks Before | Social Media and Email: Post on Nextdoor, Facebook, and/or Instagram. Email if you can.
- 1 Week Before | Flyers: Go door-to-door. Design colorful flyers, postcards, or personal invitations.
- 1 Day Before | Reminder: Send out a reminder message on social media or by email.


## Day-Of Event | 1 Hour Before

## Set Up Tasting Stations

- Set up tables and seating with labeled ice cream flavors and toppings, serving spoons or scoops, and tasting cups or cones.
- Don't take out the ice cream until your guests begin to arrive. If you have a cooler, store the ice cream outside in the cooler until you need to take them out.
