Step by Step | How to Plan this Event

💼 1-2 Months Before Event

Set a Time and Location:

- Consider **what time** your neighbors are available. Silent discos are often held in the evening with fun lighting!
- Choose a space large enough for a crowd to dance.

9 Obtain Any Necessary Permits and

Permissions

If you're closing a residential street, you will need to apply for a <u>Block Party Permit</u> for an eligible street.

Rent or Gather Equipment

Option #1 - Rent

- Rent headset equipment and a DJ for simultaneous listening on live stations!
- This is more expensive but easier for guests to enjoy.
- Check out <u>Silent Event Rentals</u>!

Option #2 - DIY

- Create themed music playlists and have neighbors bring their own phones and headphones to listen!
- This is budget-friendly for hosts, but:
 Music won't be synchronized
 - Requires neighbors to have streaming accounts (e.g., Spotify)



3-4 Weeks Before Event

Prepare Supplies

- Organize or purchase any supplies you want to include, such as lights, decorative garland, projector, and an actual disco ball.
- Have a contingency plan for tech issues! Prepare a backup music player and know where all power outlets are located.

5 Create Music Playlist

- Curate 3 fun themed music playlists. If hiring a DJ, send them the playlists!
- Spotify, YouTube, and SoundCloud offer free music streaming services with ads. Consider paying for just one month of a service for this event.



7 Extend Invitations to Neighbors!

For DIY discos, **ask neighbors** to bring headphones and a smart phone with access to the streaming service where you made your playlists.

- At Least 2-3 Weeks Before | Social Media and Email: Post on Nextdoor, Facebook, and/or Instagram. Email if you can.
- **1 Week Before | Flyers:** Go door-to-door. Design colorful flyers, postcards, or personal invitations.
- 1 Day Before | Reminder: Send out a reminder message on social media or by email.

8 Plan Event Layout

Plan for power sources, large dance area, a DJ/speaker section, refreshment stations, a photo booth, and some seating.



6 Plan a Photo Booth

Create a photo booth area with props and backdrops where attendees can take fun pictures during the disco.

Option #1: Make your own booth!

- Source funky costumes like headbands, hats, leg bands, glasses, and light up bracelets!
- Purchase or gather an instant Polaroid camera.
- · Find disco inspired props to put in the background!

Option #2: Rent a photo booth!

- If your budget allows it, research and reserve a professional photo booth with lighting, an HD camera, and full backdrop.
- One possible option is <u>Mountain Event Services.</u>





💼 Day-Of Event | 1 Hour Before

9 Arrive Early to Set Up

If hiring a DJ with silent disco equipment, **coordinate** with them to arrive early and how you can help set up.

10 Greet Neighbors!

If you rented silent disco headphones, **invite them to grab a pair**. If DIY-ing the disco, invite neighbors to **put on their own headphones**, connect to their phone, and start the playlist you made!
