Know What to Look For

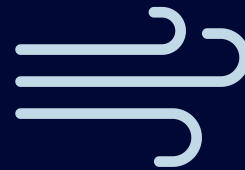
Be aware of what types of bad weather occurs in Fort Collins that could postpone your event.

Have a Backup Plan

Early on in the event planning process, **create backup plan** in case of bad weather. Consider:

- **Postponing** the event to a later date
- **Relocating** to an indoor venue
- **Hosting** virtual activities



Monitor Weather Forecast

Keep a close eye on weather forecasts leading up to your event date. Pay attention to updates from reliable sources and track any changes in weather patterns that could impact your event.

Consult Event Partners

Reach out to event partners for guidance and input on the decision to cancel. Collaborate to assess the situation and determine the best course of action.



Communicate

If the decision is made to cancel the event, **communicate this information promptly and clearly to everyone involved**. Use all available communication channels, such as email, social media, and text.
