



EMERGENCY WEATHER SHELTER PLAN

ACTIVATED

The City of Fort Collins has **ACTIVATED** the **Emergency Weather Shelter Plan**
WEDNESDAY, MARCH 9, 2022 (5 p.m.) – FRIDAY, MARCH 11 (8 a.m.)

The plan will be in operation **March 9 (Wednesday night) and March 10 (Thursday night)** due to overnight temperatures below zero degrees Fahrenheit, as forecast by the National Weather Service. The City of Fort Collins is in communication with internal City departments and external community partners to coordinate and operate shelters.

Anyone seeking overnight shelter should go to:

- a. Catholic Charities (460 Linden Center Drive) – shelter for women and families
- b. Fort Collins Rescue Mission (316 Jefferson Street) - shelter for men - lottery for beds at FCRM is held at the Murphy Center around 3:00 p.m. each day

Anyone seeking daytime shelter should go to:

- a. Women can stay all day at Catholic Charities.
- b. Men can stay all day at Fort Collins Rescue Mission.
- c. Those utilizing the overflow shelter at 212 W. Mountain (as determined by FCRM) and those who do not access overnight shelter can find day shelter at the **Murphy Center (242 Conifer Street)**.

Transfort will be operating regular business hours with stops near the Murphy Center and all shelter sites on routes 8 and 81.
